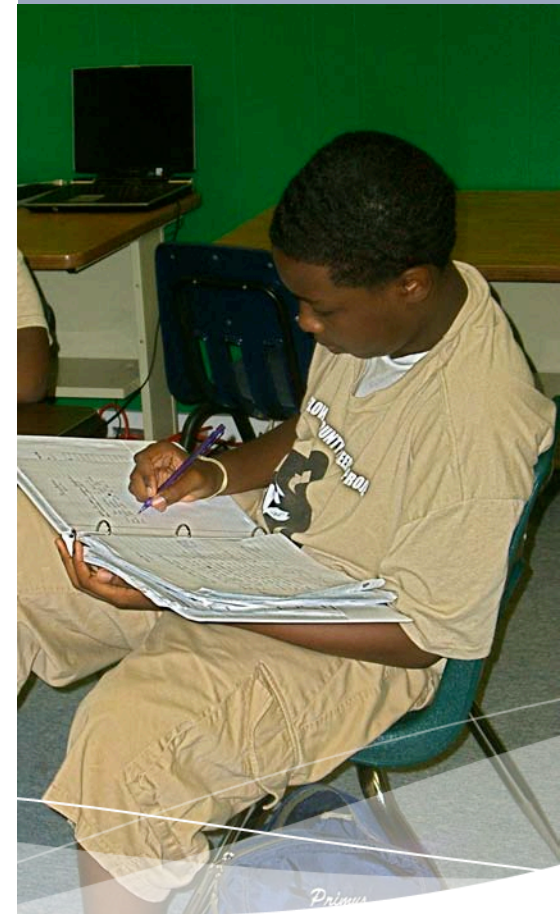

Every year Freedom Fellows renew their commitment to uphold the four tenets of LEADership; Love, Education, Action, and Discipline.

Saturday SLAM

Success through Leadership, Academics, and Mentoring. Programming includes off-campus trips, academic classes, visits from current college students, fitness, and service activities.

Study Sessions
